Issue The issue I dealt with was the neighborhood streets of Columbus not being plowed soon enough after a snowfall. Often, multiple days after a snowfall, there was still snow and ice that cover the roads.

We gathered public opinion via in-person surveys as well as electronic surveys by email to see if the public agreed with our opinion.
